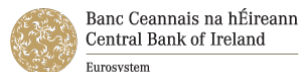

# GENERAL INFORMATION

## Public transport in Bilbao

Public transport in Bilbao—including metro, tram, and city buses—operates under a unified fare system.

You can purchase single tickets (Zone 1: €2.00; Zone 2: €2.20; Zone 3: €2.25, depending on distance) or use a rechargeable Barik Card, which offers significantly lower fares (Zone 1: €0.61; Zone 2: €0.71; Zone 3: €0.78).

The Barik Card costs €3.00, with a minimum initial top-up of €5.00. It can also be used for group travel of up to 10 people.

Both single tickets and Barik Cards are available from ticket machines at metro and tram stations, as well as in the Arrivals terminal at the airport.

On weekdays, the last metro services depart at approximately 22:30 from each terminus.

## Transfer from Bilbao Airport

**Bus:** The Bizkaibus A3247 line connects the airport with the city centre, with stops at Gran Vía and Moyua, and terminates at the Bilbao Intermodal (the main bus station). Buses run every 15–20 minutes, and the journey takes approximately 20–25 minutes. The bus fare is 4.5€, or 1.19€ with Barik Card.

**Taxi:** Taxis are available outside the arrivals terminal. The journey to the city centre takes around 15–20 minutes, depending on traffic. Approximate fare is 25–30€.

**Ride-hailing services:** Services such as Uber and Cabify operate in Bilbao and can be used for direct transfers.

# Venue

All parallel sessions and keynotes, as well as coffee breaks and lunches, will take place at **Bizkaia Aretoa**, a modern conference venue of the University of the Basque Country.

Designed by architect Álvaro Siza and inaugurated in 2011, the building is just a five-minute walk from the Guggenheim Museum Bilbao.

**Coffee breaks and lunches** will be served in Chillida Room (1st Floor).

## How to get to the venue:

The venue is centrally located and easily accessible by public transport, with both metro and tram connections nearby: **Moyua metro station**, served by metro lines L1 and L2, is a ten-minute walk away, and the **Guggenheim tram stop** is just one minute away.

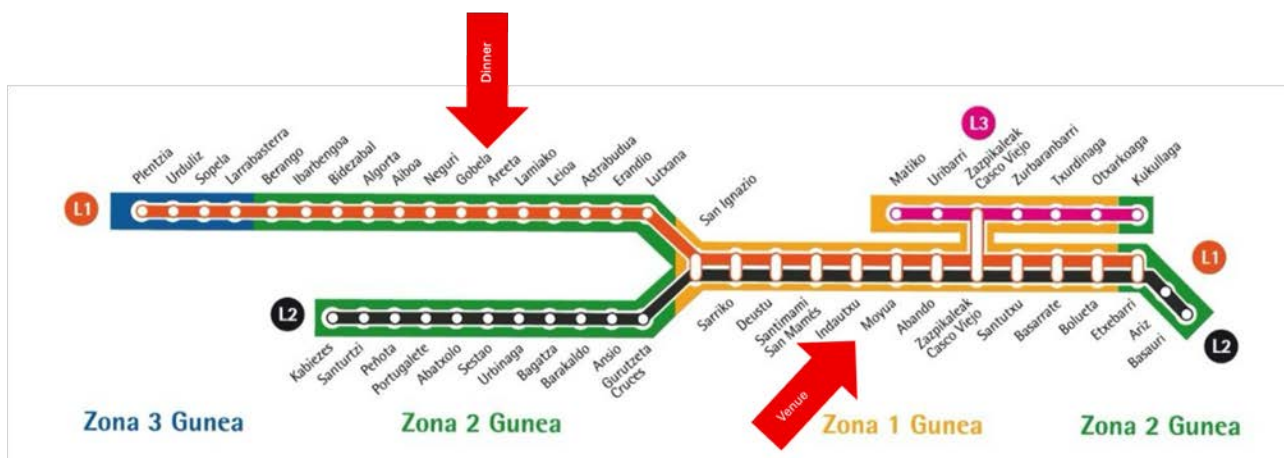

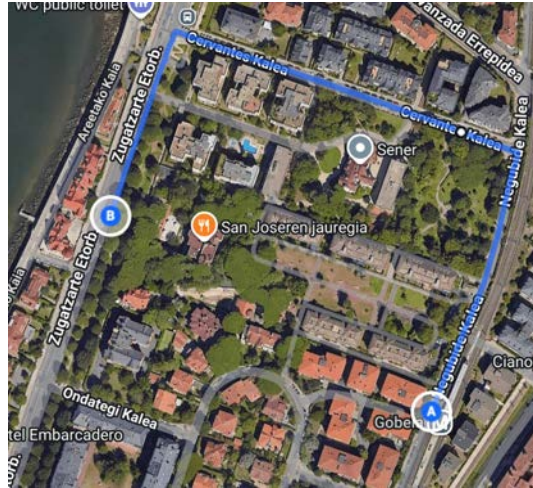
